2007 Summer Camp - Chief Logan Reservation- Ray, Ohio

1. **Physicals** - return the class 1 and 2 physical as soon as possible to Mr. Marshall.
2. Itinerary Meet at Wagnalls at 12:00 noon on Sunday, July 22- wear swim suit under scout shorts - have towel packed at the top of your pack – bring snack for afternoon. Return to Wagnalls at 1:00 pm on Saturday, July 28.
3. Uniforms- Scout shirt, Troop t-shirt, olive shorts, Scout socks, scout belt and scout hat (full Class A uniform) are required for breakfast, supper, flag ceremonies, chapel, and campfires. Other t-shirts should be brought to be worn at othertimes during the day.

5. Wednesday Family night- 5:00 pm or later Wednesday- closes at Taps- no vehicles will be permitted to exit camp beginning about 30 minutes after sunset until the close of the campfire.
6. Directions to camp
 - 1) take 23 south towards Chillicothe
 - 2) take US Route 35 towards Jackson (but don't go to Jackson)
 - 3) just after Richmond Dale you will turn left on to Elam Road- follow this for 1 ½ miles
 - 4) turn left onto Boy Scout Road- travel 2 ½ miles
 - 5) turn left onto John W Barbee Road. From there it is 1.2 miles to a hairpin turn to the right. From there you are on the gravel camp road. This road, which descends into the valley, offers beautiful scenery but it is extremely narrow and should be traveled with caution. It is 1½ miles from the hairpin turn to the camp gateway.
